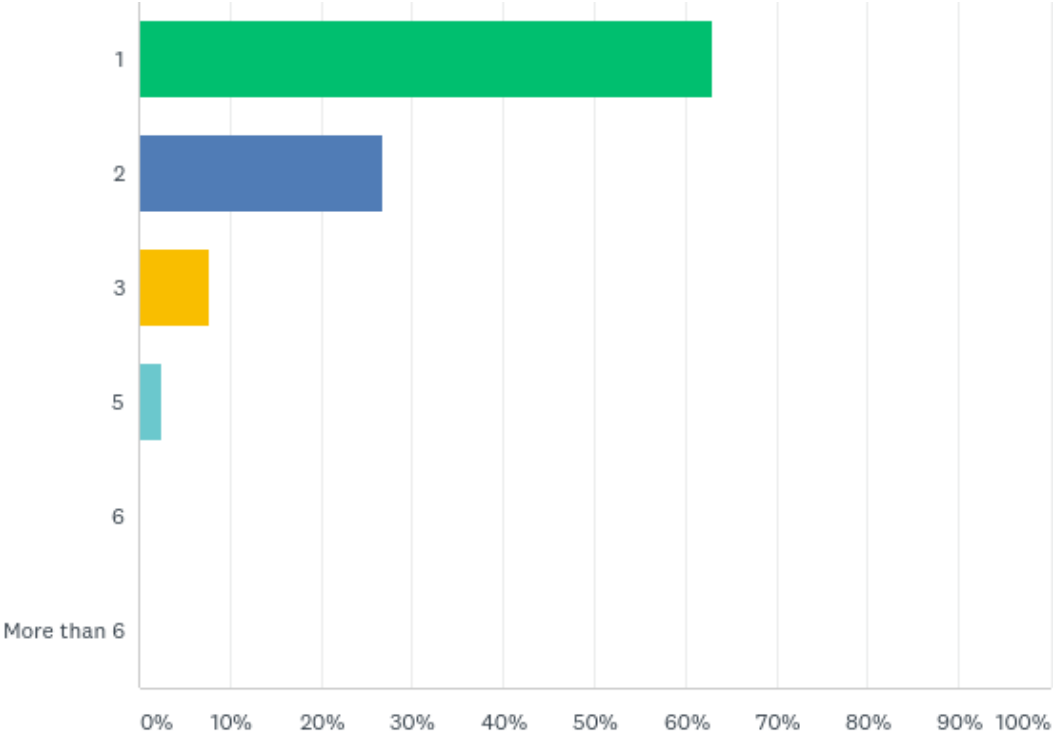

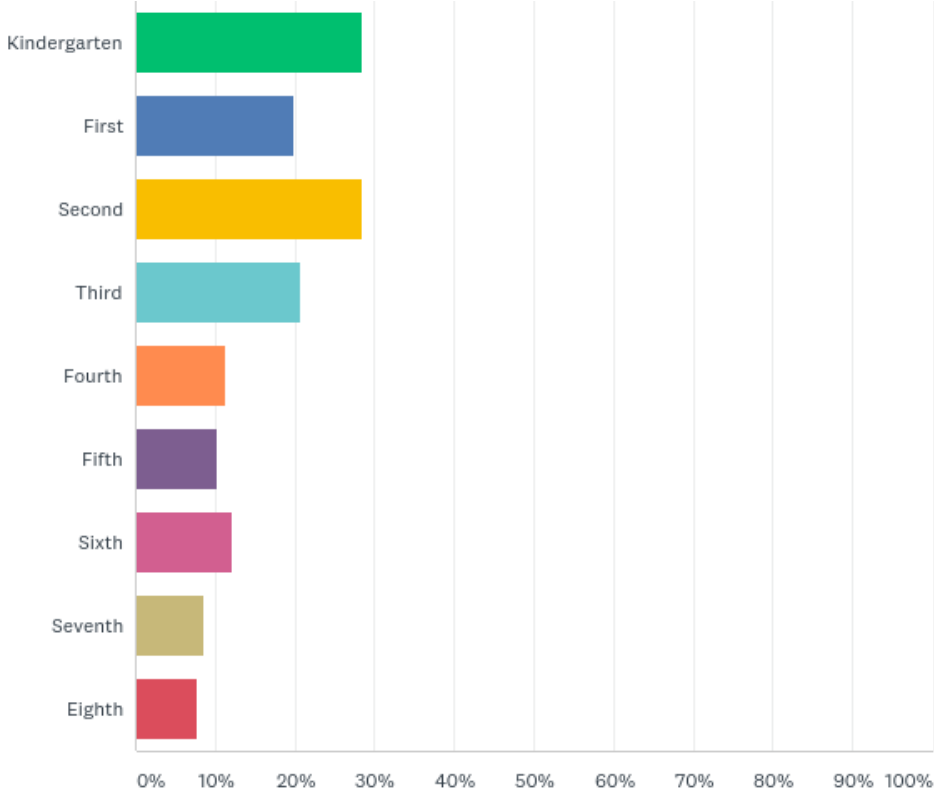
Q2: How many students do you have enrolled at MITCH?

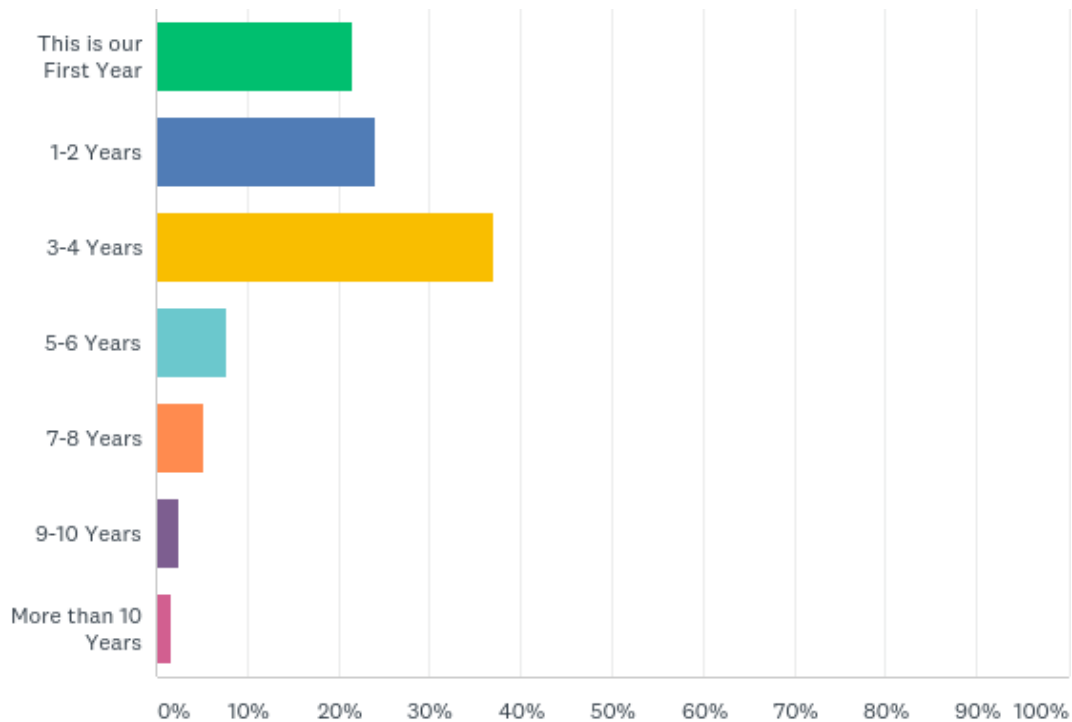
Q3: In which grade(s) do you have students at MITCH?

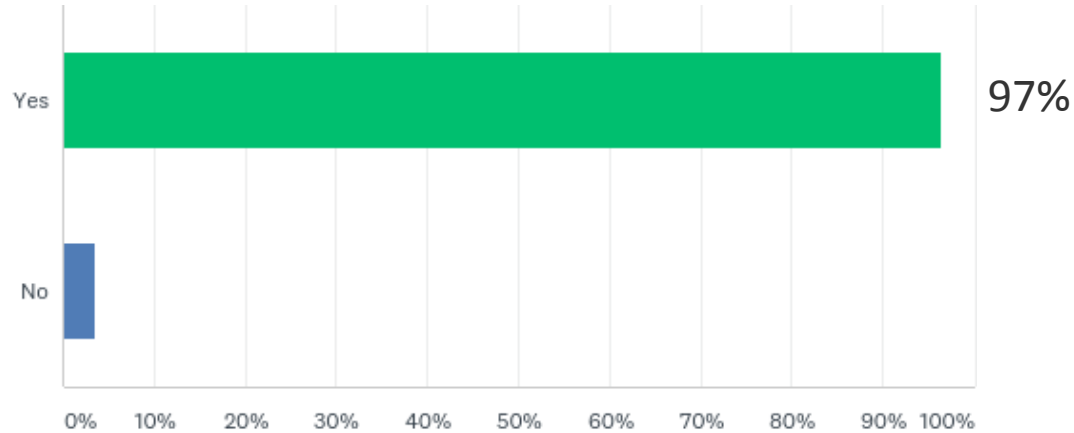

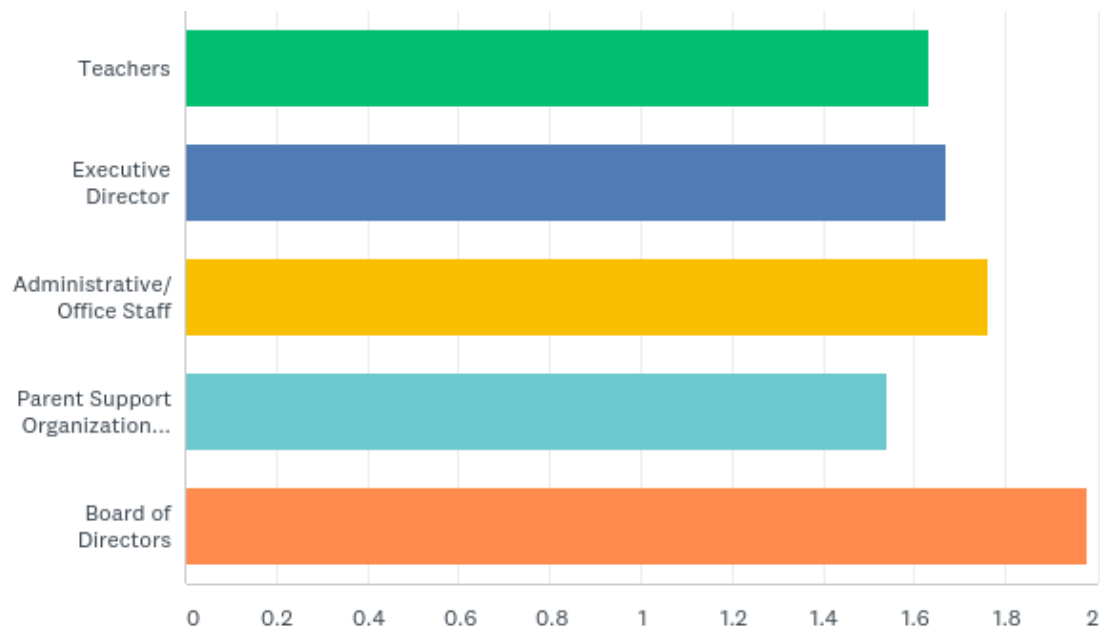

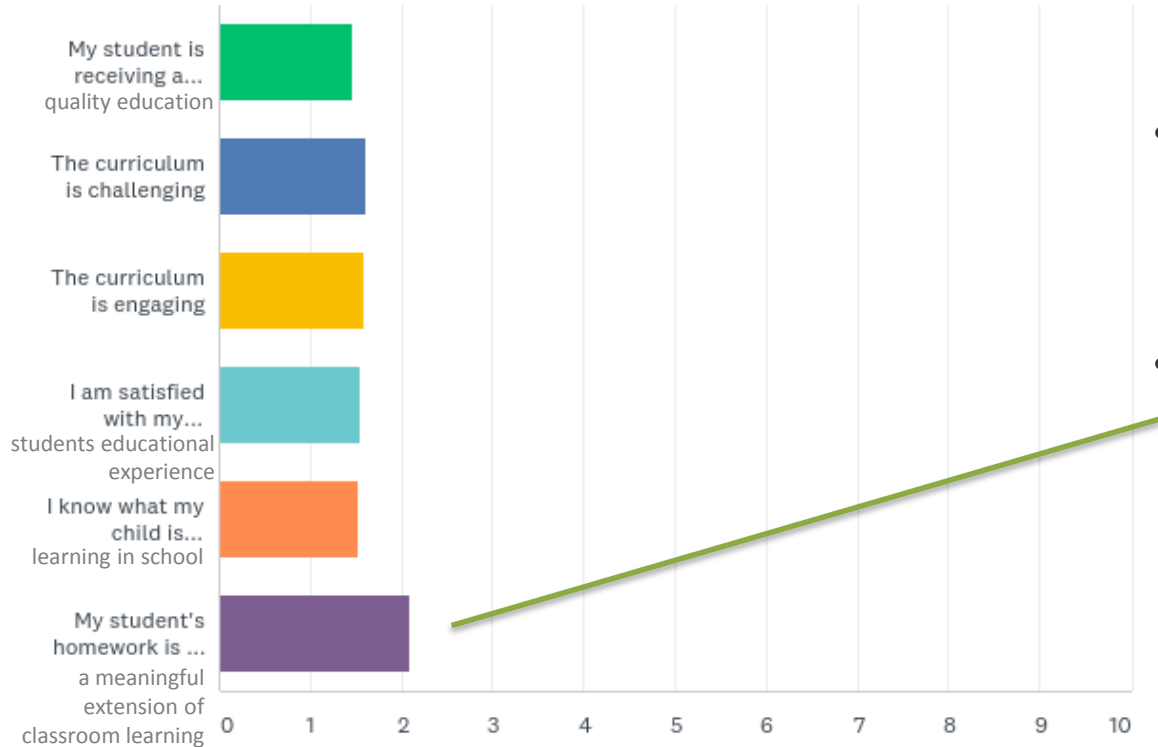

Q8: Please tell us about your student's educational experience at MITCH according to this scale:

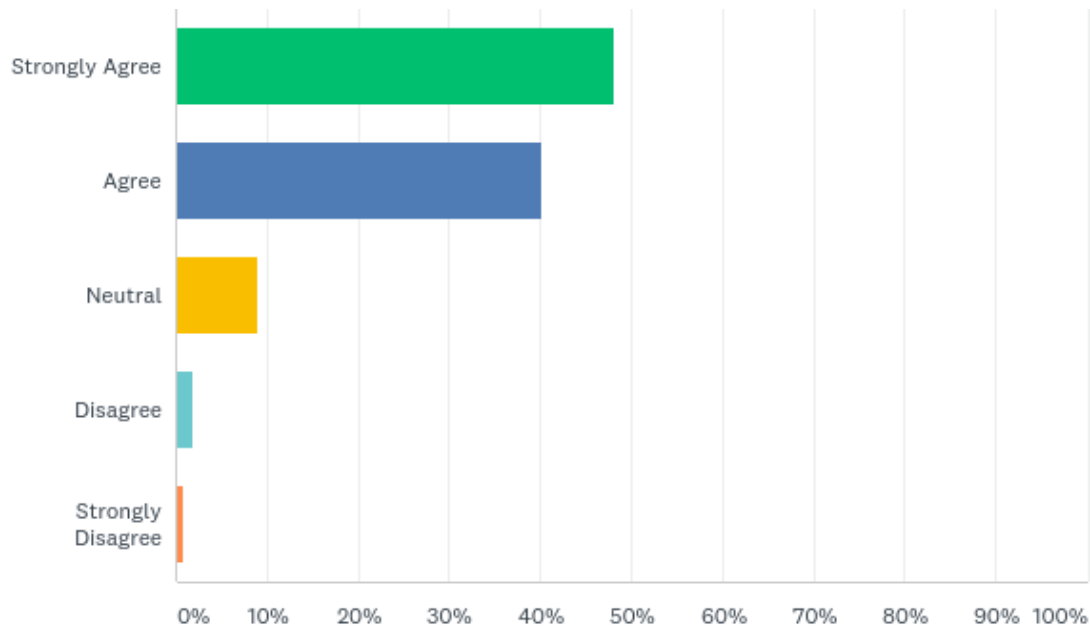

- The only response with a meaningful disagree score was homework with 11% disagreeing.

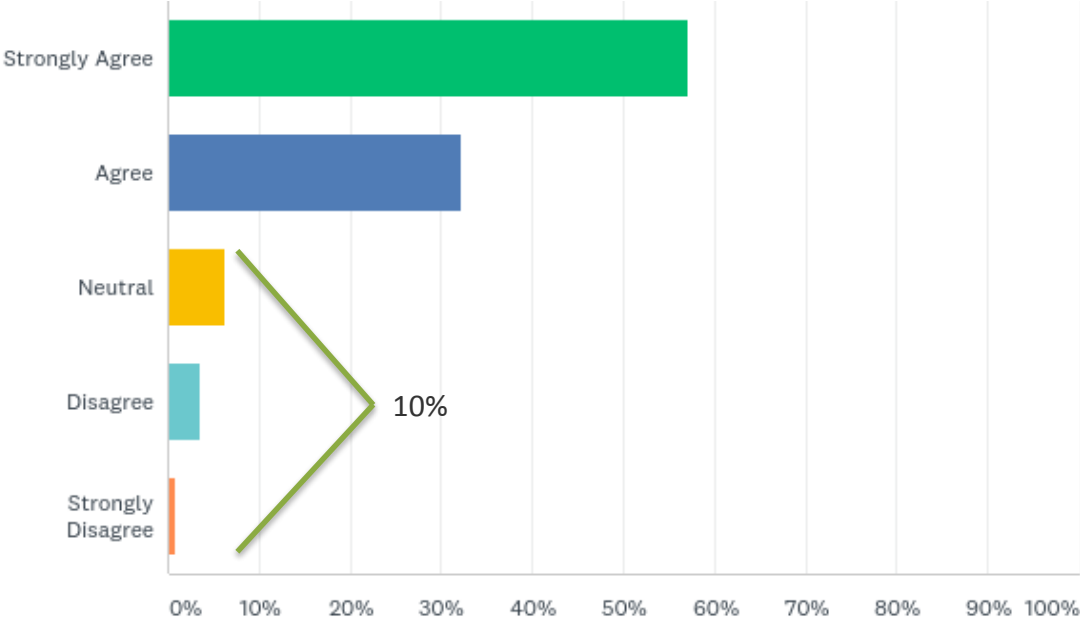
Q12: Please tell us if you believe that our school provides qualified teachers to support student learning according to this scale:

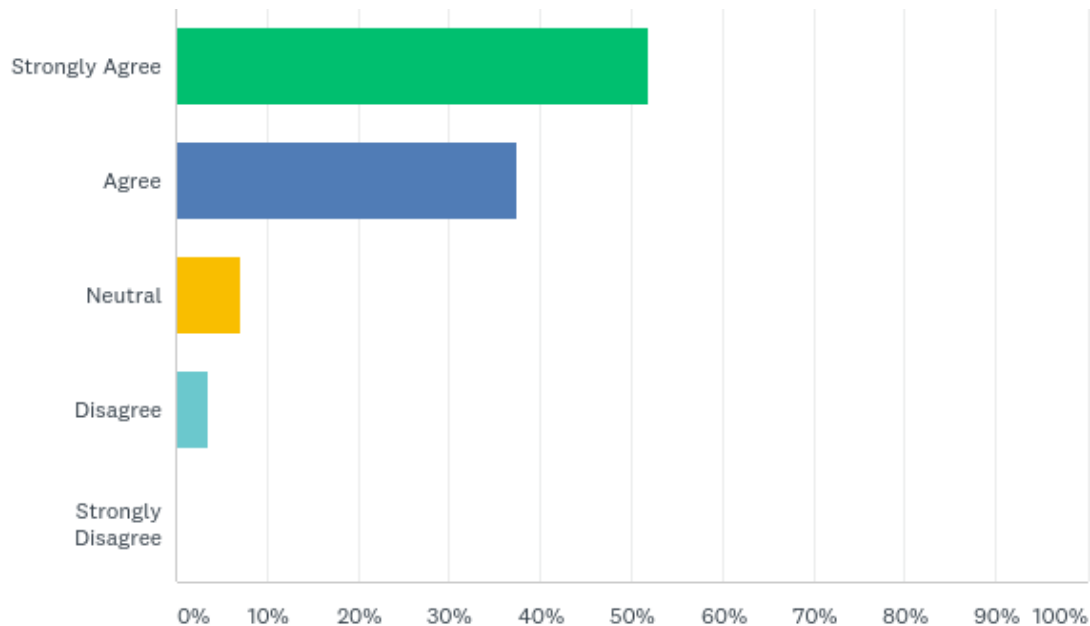
Q13: Please tell us if you believe that our school provides a safe learning environment according to this scale:

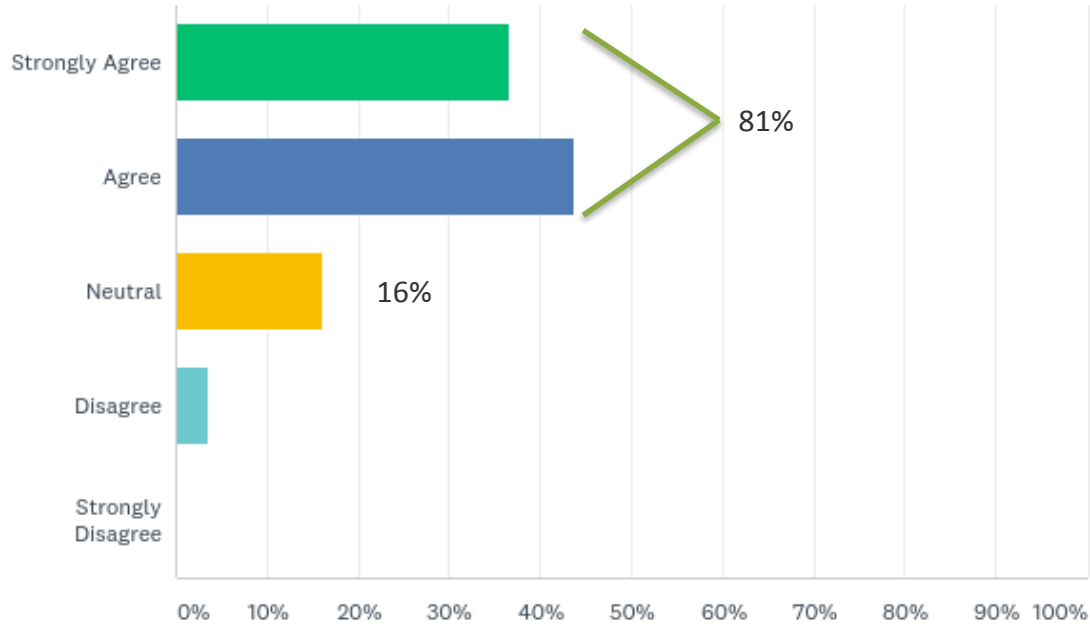
Q14: Please tell us if you believe that our school ensures that instructional time is protected and interruptions are minimized according to this scale:

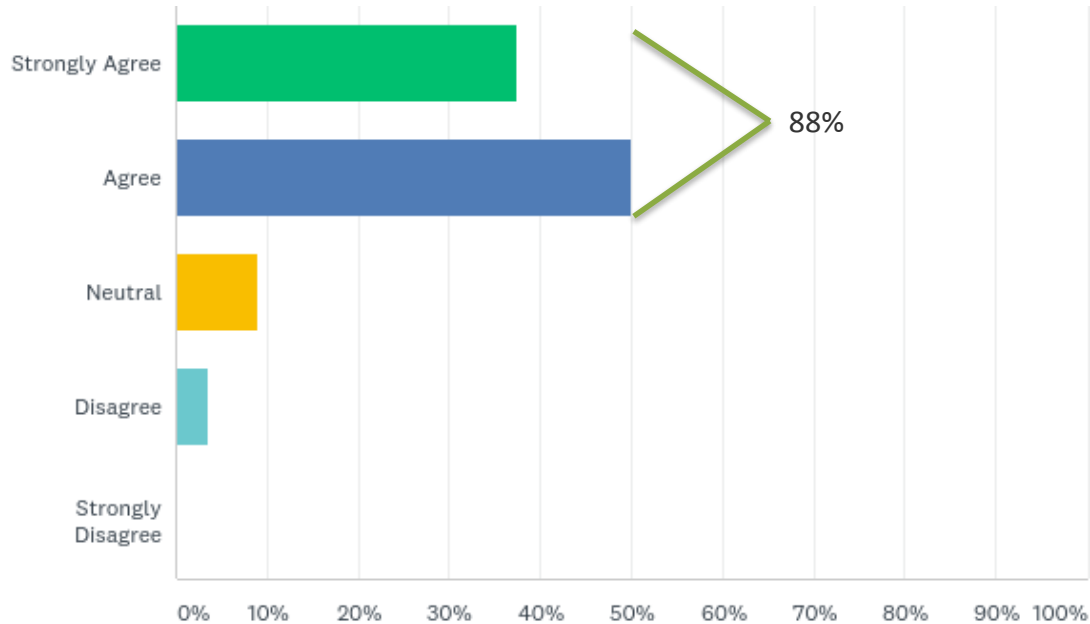

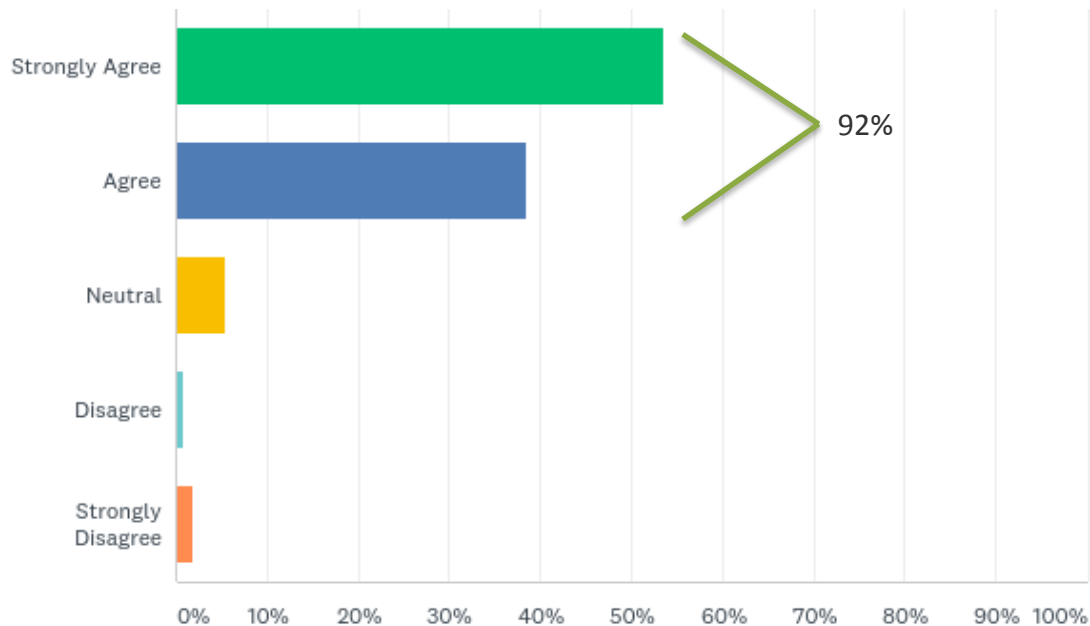

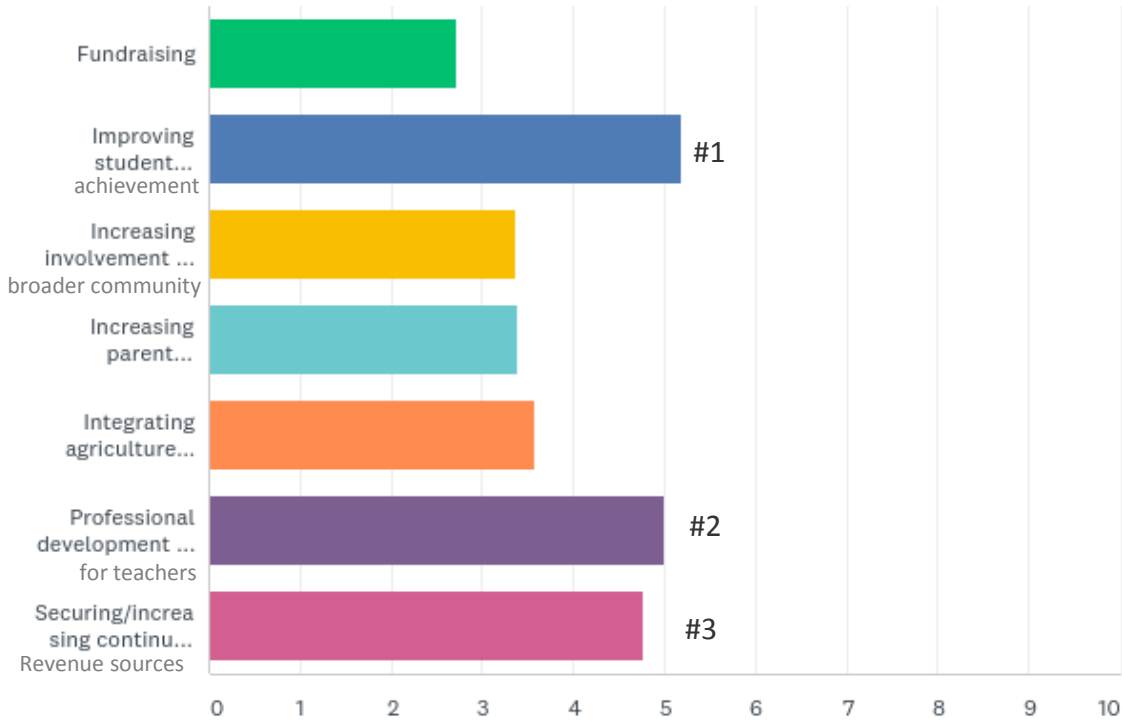

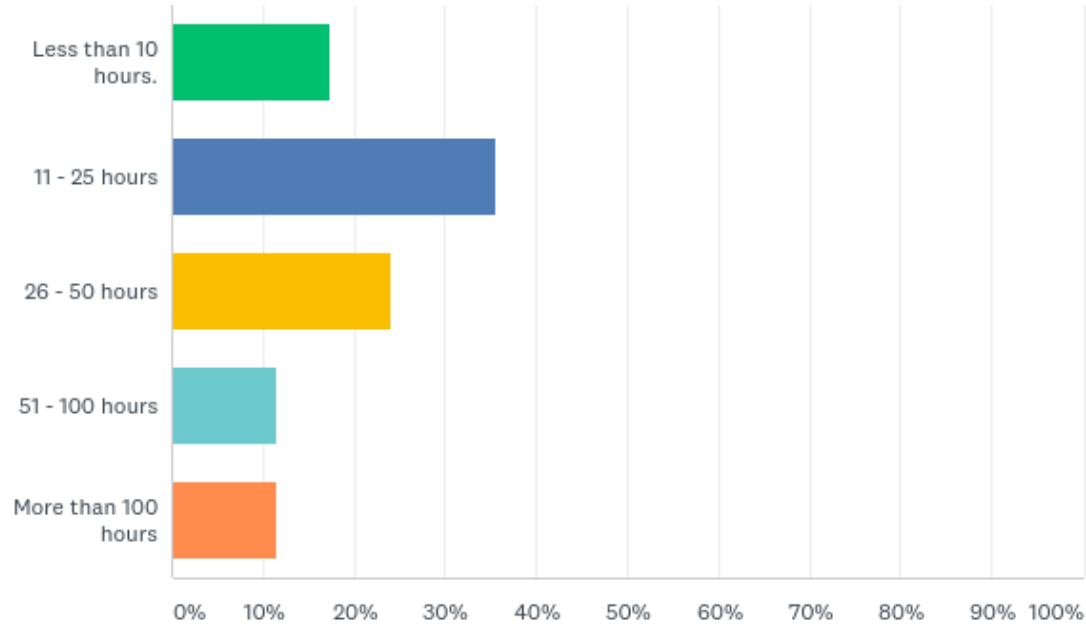

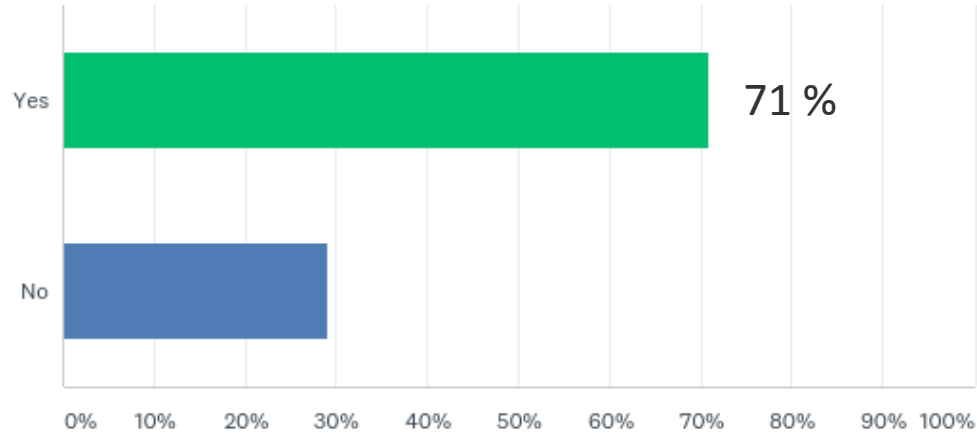

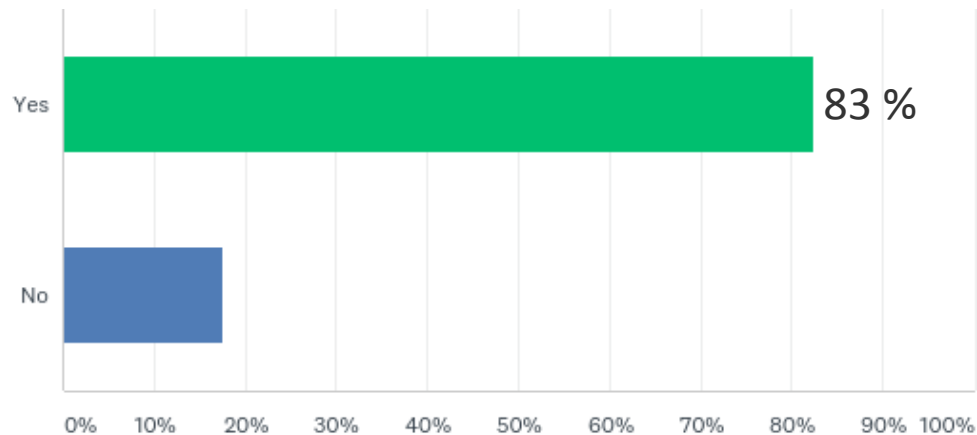
Q26: If transportation was available to and from MITCH, would you use it?

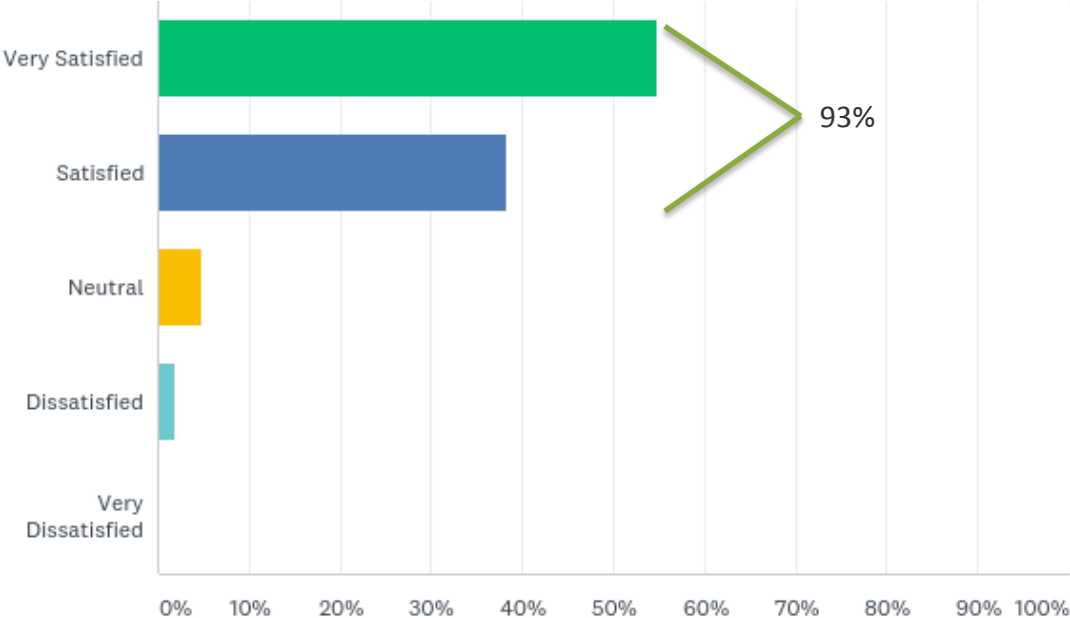
Q27: If transportation is available to and from MITCH, are you willing to adjust the beginning and ending time of the school day?

- “We love the teachers and what the children are learning about. It's a positive environment that we are proud to be a part of!”
- “I know the decision has been finalized regarding offering 6-8 grades in the future, but that was one of the reasons we came to MITCH... a better/smaller alternative for those transition/maturing years. Thank you for all you do. Our family has been blessed by this community.”
- “This is really a great school. The emphasis on academic achievement and high expectations of students is so rare in public education, so you have something really special here. It is a tough balance though finding how to assign challenging homework without being excessive, and I'd say the balance tends towards too much. I don't believe in no-homework for elementary students but some creativity is in order. Walk to Math is the right idea but also results in some crazy class sizes that takes away from student learning and probably teacher satisfaction. Also results in some less motivated kids from upper grades coming down to classes where they bring negative attitudes to kids who walked-up to that grade. Probably need to split up some of the bigger math classes.”
